The meeting opened with the singing of the Star-Spangled Banner. The invocation was offered by the Rev. Charles H. Pinchbeck, of the Seventh Baptist Church of Baltimore. Hon. James F. Thrift represented Mayor Preston, of Baltimore, in welcoming the teachers to the city. The response to the address of welcome was delivered by Dr. M. Bates Stephens, State Superintendent of Education, Baltimore. A selection was then rendered by the pupils from the Western High School, under the direction of Miss Jessie L. Armstrong, assistant supervisor of music, Baltimore city. This was followed by an address by Dr. William Chandler Bagley, professor of education. Teachers College, Columbia University.
