For example, the boy names Casey and Pacey are now next to each other. There are over 2800 names here, but my lists are not padded with alternate spellings of the same name, i.e.: Rachel and Rachael. If it doesn t effect pronunciation, I ve only listed a name once. Some people like traditional spellings, some like names spelled phonetically, and some like to really mix it up. I will leave that up to you. By clustering names with the same ending, you ll get a better feel for a name you re...
